

Bylaw No. 06/22

Rural Municipality of Meadow Lake #588

A BYLAW TO EXTEND THE TIME REQUIRED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE **2021 FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

The Council of the RM of Meadow Lake #588 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

For the 2021 financial year, the time required for completion of certain financial and audit procedures for the RM of Meadow Lake #588 be extended as follows:

- (a) The time required pursuant to subsection 185(1) of The Municipalities Act to complete the annual audit of the municipality's books and records of the annual financial statement be and is extended to September 13, 2022.
- (b) The time required pursuant to subsection 186(1) of The Municipalities Act for the submission of a copy of the financial statement and the auditor's report be and is extended to September 29, 2022.
- (c) The time required pursuant to subsection 185(3) of The Municipalities Act to publicize the financial statement or synopsis and auditor's report be and is extended to November 30, 2022.
